President Ronald Reagan is viewed as the man who put an end to the threat of communism around the world. For four decades Ronald Reagan dedicated his life to serving the American people. Our History Day project will examine the life and legacy of President Ronald Reagan and how he is viewed as the President who restored hope in the American Government, took down the Soviet Union and the Berlin Wall.

When we learned what this year's theme was we immediately agreed on President Ronald Reagan. We both had an interest in how America won the Cold War and what Reagan's involvement with the war was. One of the members of our group's love for Ronald Reagan started last year when they visited Reagan's presidential library in Simi Valley, California. At the library people learn first hand the problems of the late 1970's and early 1980's.
